A brief update on some of our activities and goings on as we approach this fall and things to think about.

- Hall Johnson Trees and Landscaping We have made a lot of progress. You may have seen the new
 landscaping within Section 5 of our Wall. It was planted in February and survived the Texas Freeze of
 2021. The landscaping appears to have survived which bodes well for the Landscaping Committee to
 continue with the agreed upon plans of beautifying our appearance.
- I'd like to make note of two awards received by our Colleyville Police Department this summer as they
 have been recognized by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) for its work in solving
 two high profile cases one that brought down a worldwide sex trafficking website and one that

- Joanna Budries and the Social Committee have done a great job with two events this summer; the first being the Neighborhood BBQ and then the 4th of July Parade. Next year we plan on moving the parade route to the SE side of Highland Meadows to expand our engagement throughout the neighborhood. The route is yet to be determined as we are seeking those streets that best demonstrate their patriotism with the US Flag being flown during the Holidays.
- We continue to receive reports and more recently photos of neighbors depositing bagged droppings of their pets in other neighbors' yards or in other neighbor curbside trash. This is unacceptable and quite frankly disgusting. So as not to embarrass anyone at this time we are not publishing the captured photos. Please keep in mind many homes in our HOA have security cameras that are active 24x7. We may reconsider our position for repeat offenders if the practice continues.
- As some of you may not be aware, the Texas Legislature recently passed changes to Texas HOA
 requirements. We are very fortunate to be as well organized as we are as the State has made some
 changes to HOA Policies and Regulation requirements. We are working closely with our attorneys to
 meet these reporting, and operating requirements, some of which went into effect on September 1st
 and others scheduled for next year.
- Annual Meeting Our annual Meeting will be held at The Colleyville Center on October 21st at 7:00 pm. I and my fellow Board members and Committee Members look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible. We will enjoy sharing our Current State as your HOA as well as our plans and activities while seeking your input on potential activities or concerns.

Congratulations to the July Curb Appeal award winners Kristen and Vic Crawford of 2406 Highland Meadow. The Crawford's have lived in our neighborhood for 8.5 glorious years! A couple of years ago they decided to extract all the existing plants in their yard and replace them with a variety of different foliage to help modernize the landscape and provide an aesthetic they would love for years to come. And then came "Snowmageddon"... which claimed the lives of several Azalea and Gardenia plants in the front and back yard. But the Crawford's forged on, replanted and brought their yard back to life in spectacular fashion! Drive on by to check out the breathtaking variety of Azaleas, Rose of Sharon, Lantana, Crepe Myrtle, Begonias, Caladiums, Variety of Ferns, Yucca, Texas Sage, Hydrangea, Hibiscus and their favorite,



Tiger's Eye. Congrats Kristen and Vic! Thank-you for keeping our neighborhood beautiful!

Congratulations to the August Curb Appeal Winners Nancy and Jim Lewis at 2104 Highland Meadows.

Formerly from Iowa (Go Cyclones), they moved to Highland Meadows in August 1996. They were looking at homes on July 4th and came across this neighborhood celebrating the holiday with a parade and BBQ. Observing this fun and inclusive neighborhood activity, solidified their decision to buy this house vs. others they were looking at. In their Post-retirement lives, with more time on their hands, they began to notice how overgrown and blah the bushes looked. This led to a major overhaul, removing everything and starting fresh.

Working with landscaper Michael from Walkabout Landscaping, they agreed on a design that would complement the house and the dry creek bed running through the front yard. A focal point was adding more color instead of just replacing green bushes; placing

emphasis on perennials so yearly planting would not be necessary.

For the design they chose a variety of colors, size, shape and textures to create more interest. The phlox, salvia, plumbago, dianthus, scabiosa, hydrangeas, and daisies provide colors in pink, red, lavender, white, yellow and blue while the sea thrift, lemon ball sedum, albia twist of lime, lambs ear and blooming rosemary provide a variety of shapes, textures, and colors of green. By the way, the hummingbirds love the hot lips

salvia [©]. I especially love how they incorporated elements of hardscape throughout the yard which provides added variety and sightlines.

The project was completed about a year ago but has taken a full year to spread out and better fill the bed areas. They were fortunate to not have lost many plants during the past challenging winter but we did replace a couple. Nancy and Jim hope the neighborhood is enjoying the new landscaping as much as they are. I, for one, can say that I am a fan! Keep up the great work Nancy and Jim!

Please don't start exterior home modifications without ACC approval; nor submit an ACC application with incomplete data – it will delay your project. File for ACC approval <u>before</u> you undertake projects on your property. Our CCRs require us to respond to ACC requests in 15 business days after we receive the ACC application and all documentation. Not sure if you



September 20, 2021 Board Meeting Recap The board met with homeowners prior to our normal Board meeting on Monday, Sept. 20th, to discuss two issues. First, a Tree Replacement Program offering homeowners on Ballantrae who lose a tree on the backside of their property (Hall Johnson Rd,) reimbursement for planting a new tree. Homeowners gave feedback on the program, suggested who should receive reimbursement and how much per tree. The Board will finalize the program and reach out to homeowners on Ballantrae.

The second issue was updating the landscaping and fencing on Whitehaven North. Landscape improvements for this are were put on hold while we finalized wall repairs. Now that we are able to proceed, Whitehaven



homeowners shared their current concerns, what they would like to see done to the landscaping and wooden fence, as well as suggestions for selection of trees and planting choices. The board will get quotes for fencing and landscape modifications and share those with Whitehaven homeowners prior to finalizing the plan.

She recommends a grouping of at least 50 bulbs to make an impact in your landscaping. Mixing tulips, daffodils and amaryllis will give quite a colorful and dramatic grouping – which is what you saw at our subdivision entrances last spring.

Bulbs come from ABBOTT-IPCO, the world's leader in production and distribution of the widest selection of bulb varieties. They will arrive in January, <u>pre-chilled</u>, and ready for planting.
